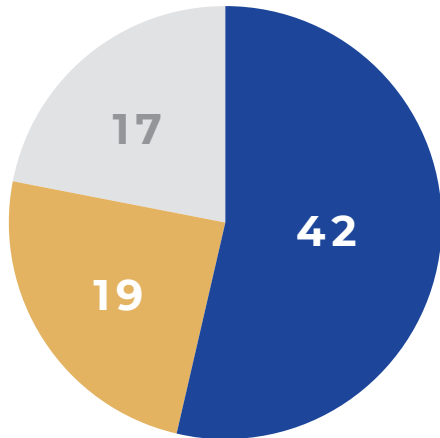

“That the redevelopment will continue to stop progress in the overall area by concentrating poverty leading to poor outcomes for children, crime and excessive litter”

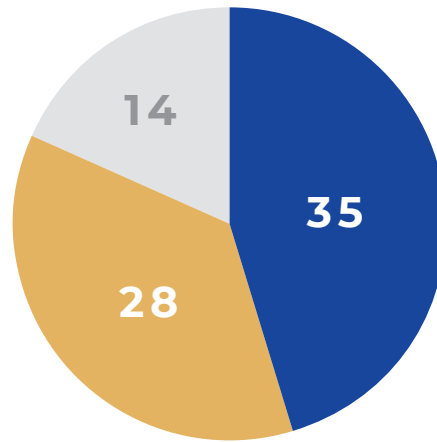
“I am concerned that long time residents who own homes will be pushed out, the affordable housing will not be affordable and the culture of the neighborhood will change”

“That it will be gentrified and designed to push existing residents out”

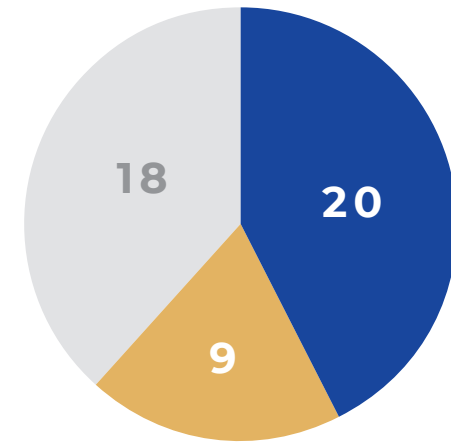

Returning Post Development

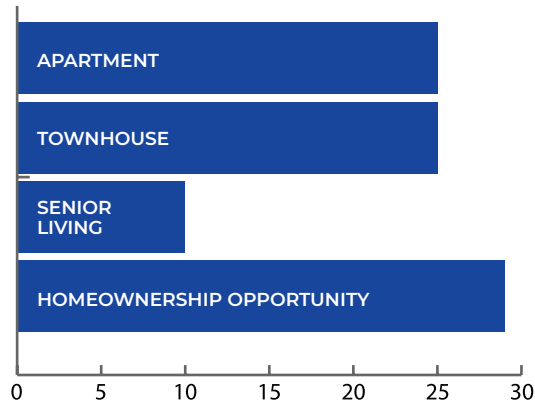

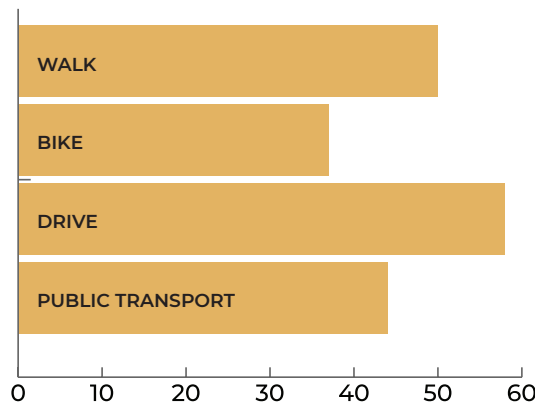
Housing Preference

“Identify the history. Make a documentary and tear down Robles Park all together give our people back their land!”

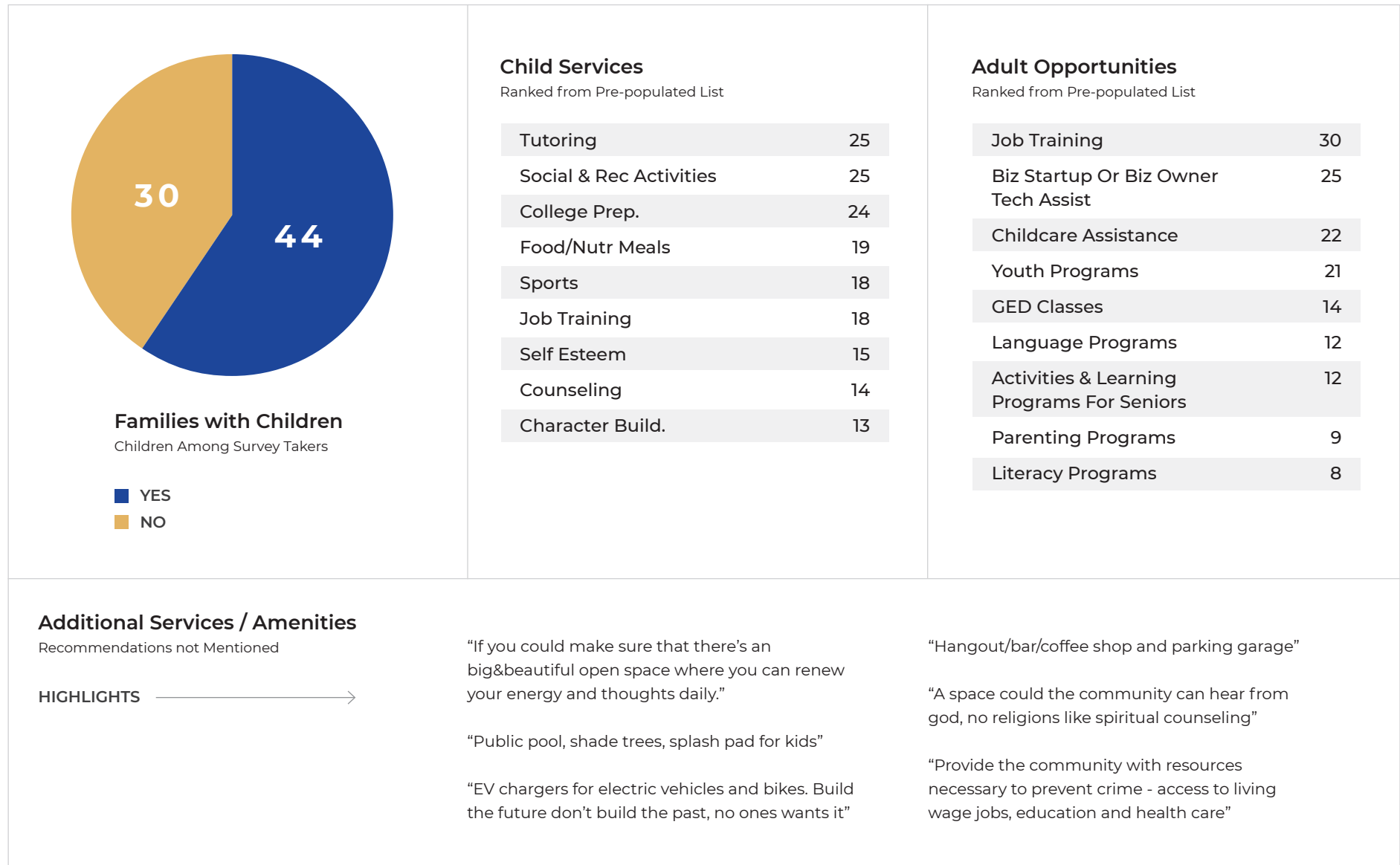
“Have something that brings the community out to educated them more a community gathering or BBQ”

“I’m not sure how difficult this would be, but perhaps have a wall of names of the deceased”

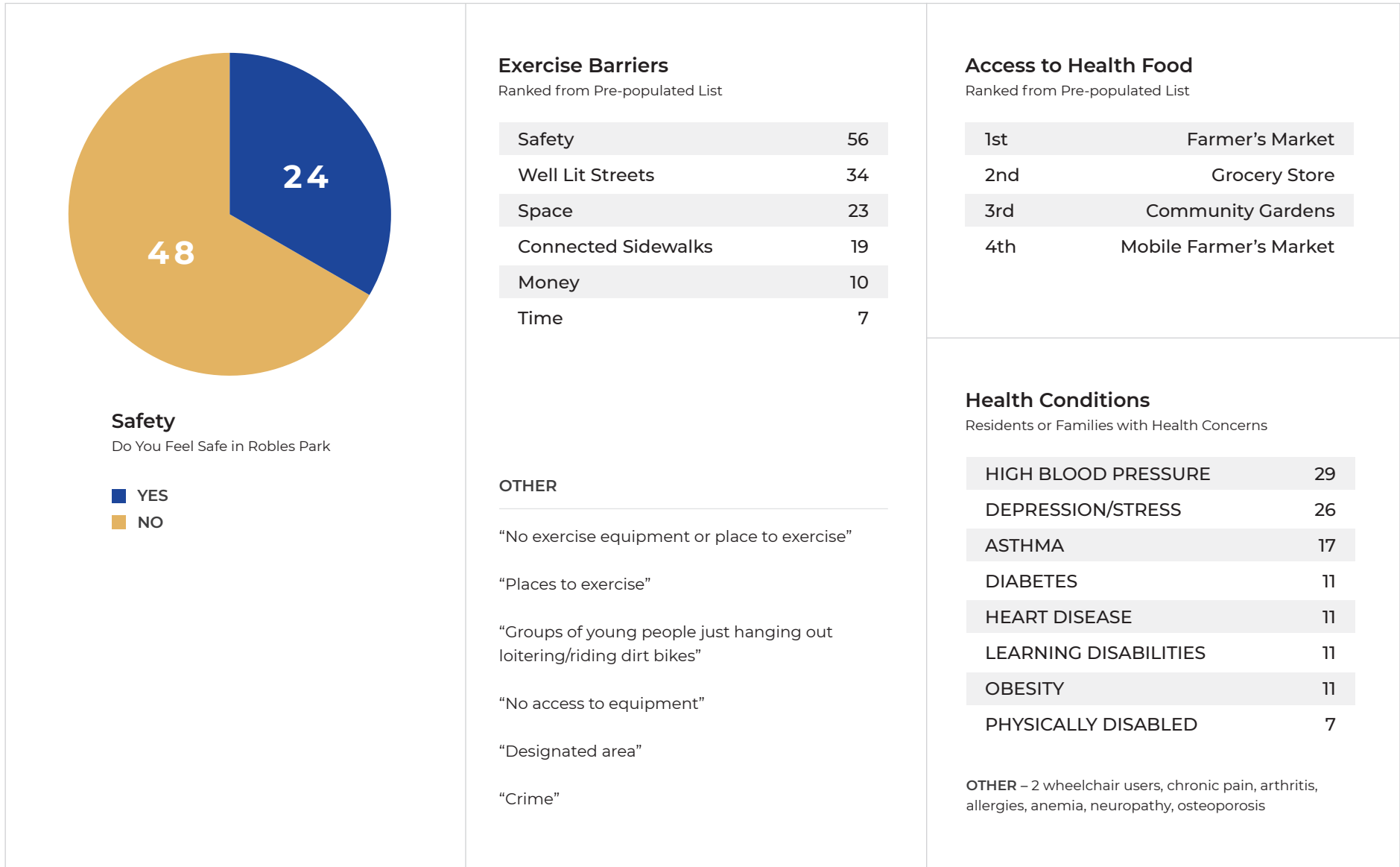
“Review other black cemeteries in the South, observe their significance - offering spaces, family trees that were planted, other symbolism.”

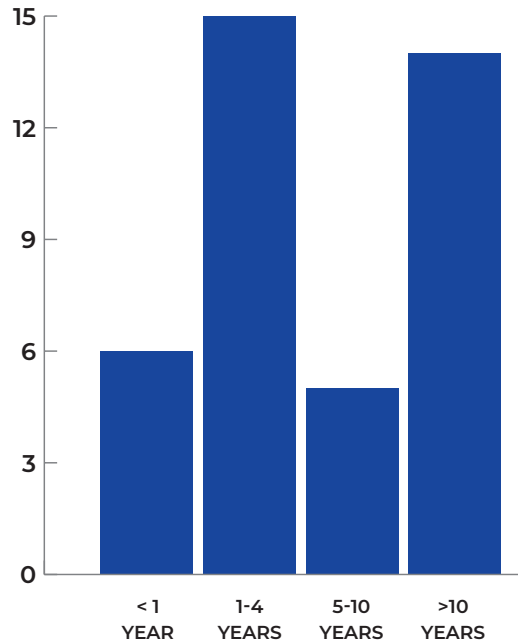

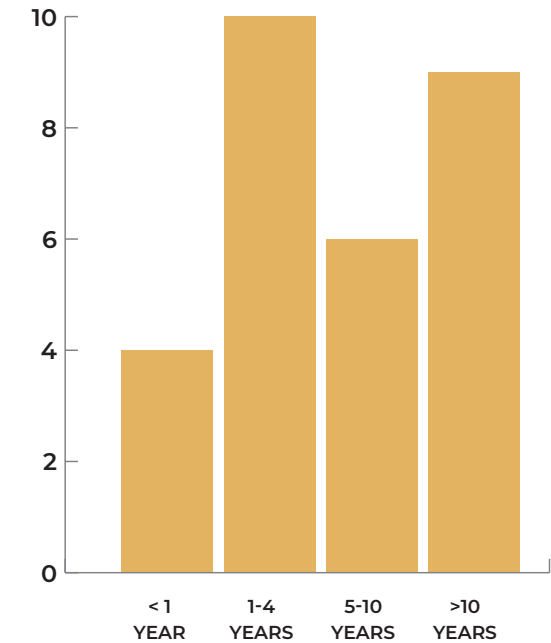
Robles Residency Time

Tampa Heights Residency Time

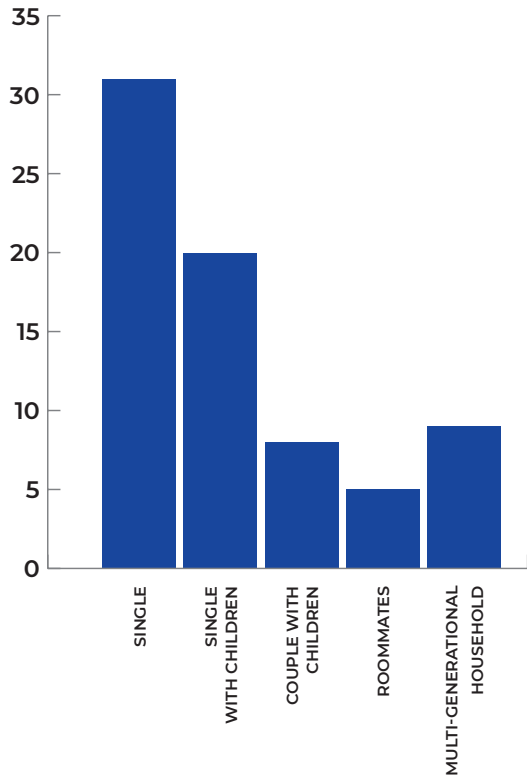
How Long Respondent Has Lived in Tampa Heights

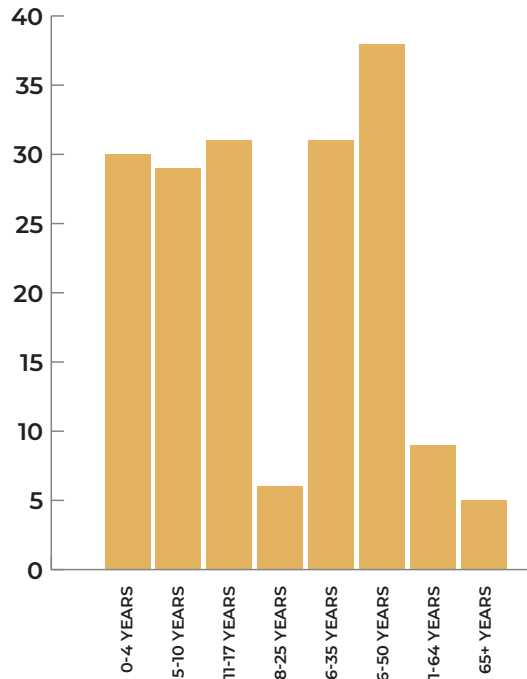
Household Type
